Jenny (below with Annette) left Cambodia in the time of the Khmer Rouge. While in a concentration camp she met some missionaries who gave her a Bible and led her to faith in Christ. After seeing her father starve to death in the camp, then separated from her family, she escaped to America as a refugee. Where she met her husband, a dentist. After one year of marriage, they together returned to Cambodia as missionaries. Once back in Cambodia, she found her family and now they have joined her in faith and serving Jesus. I (Annette) was so impressed with Jenny's childlike faith and deep satisfaction in living for Jesus. She has seen and endured much tragedy and hardship, yet, she has contentment, peace and few expectations. She told me having food was all she needed! One of my highlights of this trip was hearing Jenny pray in Khmer in our small group. She inspires me to find my contentment in Jesus and Him alone...well maybe some food too.
